- “*Cub Resident Camp*” is open to all registered Wolf, Bear and Webelos and their parent(s).
- “*Webelos Outpost Adventure*” is open to all registered Webelos (parents are welcome) (Webelos can attend either “*Cub Resident Camp*” or “*Webelos Outpost Adventure*”)
- “*Tiger Safari*” is open to all registered Tiger Cubs and their parent(s). (A parent must attend).

Sorry no siblings can attend any of the Resident Camp programs.

“*Cub Resident Camp*” & “*Webelos Outpost Adventure*” fees for the weekend are \$40 per Scout and \$15.00 per adult partner. This includes breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday, breakfast on Sunday, and a patch.

“*Tiger Safari*” fees for the Saturday-Sunday program are \$35 per Scout and \$12.00 per adult partner. This includes lunch and dinner on Saturday, breakfast on Sunday, and a patch.

ACTIVITIES include: BB guns, Archery, Sling Shot, Crafts, Nature Trail, Obstacle Course, Rank Program, and themed program activities. Look for the 2007 Resident Camp Guide at www.eacbsa.org

MISSION TO MARS 2007

DATES/TIMES

Cub Resident Camp and Webelos Outpost will be April 20-22 beginning at 3:30 p.m. Friday and ending at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday. Tiger Safari will be April 21 & 22 beginning at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday and ending at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday. The camp will be held at Mt Bayou Scout Camp, near Chicot State Park, in St. Landry, Louisiana. Upon arrival please expect a quick medical re-check and also your scouts setting up your camp-site. The more your paperwork is organized, the smoother your check-in will be. In the past, the slowest spot is with paperwork. You will be given a schedule of opening events upon your arrival.

REGISTRATION

Registration information can be found on our council website www.eacbsa.org, to be sure everyone received the information, please share this information with the Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts of your pack.

INDIVIDUAL REGISTRATION FEES

Cub Resident Camp and Webelos Outpost Adventure will cost each Scout \$40.00 if paid by April 2 or \$50.00 if paid after April 2, 2007. Each adult including leaders may attend for \$15.00. No program is provided for siblings. Each pack should try and bring with them a Den Chief. Den Chiefs may attend for \$15.00. The Camp Fee covers:

- Four cafeteria-style meals in the dining hall (Outpost participants will prepare dinner Saturday night at their campsite.
- A supervising, every experienced staff
- Supplies and camp activities
- Use of beautiful Mt Bayou Scout Camp
- Unique experience of an organized Cub Resident Camp and Outpost Adventure

REFUND POLICY

The complete fee is non-refundable after the deadline date except for illness or death in the family. A request for this type of refund must be in writing and received in the Scout Service Center by May 15, 2007.

SUPERVISION

Supervision will be provided by a volunteer staff and adult leaders of each pack. Each pack is required to have a minimum of two adult leaders in camp at all times. Parents of Scouts may fulfill this requirement even if not registered with Scouting. It is required that the ratio be one adult for every five scouts. During the structured activity times, the Scouts will be supervised by the adult volunteer staff. Activity areas that require specialized supervision, such as archery range, and BB gun range, will be under the supervision of certified staff. At **ALL** other times such as meals, campfires, and camp-wide games, the Scouts will be supervised by the adult volunteers of each pack.

ADULT VOLUNTEERS ARE EXPECTED TO FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES:

- * Adult volunteers should sit at the same table with their group of scouts at all meals.
- * Adult volunteers should know where their scouts are at all times.
- * Adult volunteers should monitor the scouts' behavior at all times. Do not stand by while your scouts are whittling trees or fighting with sticks or other objects.
- * Each program supervisor will announce whether or not assistance will be needed.
- * **Observe the No Smoking Policy of the BSA.** A designated area will be announced for our smoking leaders.

CAMP PHONE

The phone at camp is for business and emergency use only. Please discourage parents from making unnecessary calls to their sons or vice-versa. In case of emergency:

EMERGENCY PHONE LIST

The adult volunteers must have a list of phone numbers of the parents and closest relative of the scouts in their group. This emergency communication is very important for the safety of your scouts. Don't overlook the importance of proper communications.

VISITORS

Visitors are welcome at anytime. We ask that you check in at the Health Lodge when you arrive. Meal cost for visitors is \$3.00 per person per meal. Meal tickets are available at the Camp Trading Post.

CAMP THEME 2007

The theme this year is MISSION TO MARS!! We are planning a fun-filled action packed time built around a Space Theme. The event will conclude on Sunday with the cubs launching air rockets they will build at camp. The focus of Cub Camp is to acquaint Scouts with an outdoor experience and for Webelos Scouts to be a transitional step to Boy Scout Camping. We also offer advancement opportunities for Webelos. The program areas will be planned so that they are fun, have a variety of activities, and maybe, just maybe teach the Scouts something.

OUTPOST CAMP

One of our exciting programs this year is the Webelos outpost program. This program is designed for the boys to experience a unique overnighter with their peers. When they arrive at the outpost camp, they will spend the night in a tent they will pitch, put up a dining fly, and work on various other scout skills. They will help prepare dinner and breakfast the next morning. Don't worry, all the food will be provided. Remember to pack light as the boys will hike to the camping spot. For many, this will be their first look at what Boy Scouts do. Because of the need for adult supervision, each pack will need to provide adults to accompany their scouts on this event. Participants in the outpost program will need to bring a light backpack or day pack to carry the essentials they will need for an overnight camp. (See packing list for more information). We encourage all Webelos to take part in this fun filled program, and most if not all of the requirements of the Outdoorsman activity badge will be worked on with the boys.

SPENDING MONEY

Mt Bayou Lake Scout Camp operates a full service Trading Post with souvenirs, candy, soft drinks, and other items to serve the needs of the campers. We do not want spending money to be a problem at camp. Parents and scouts should decide what is a reasonable amount for the week. A \$25.00 maximum is suggested.

DINING HALL

The food service is provided by qualified personnel. We eat cafeteria style in our dining hall. We ask that you provide a table waiter for your table at each meal who will be responsible for cleaning up your area and wiping down the table. Scouts who have **dietary restrictions** may request substitutes by notifying the Scout Service Center in writing 2 weeks prior to coming to camp. For those with severe dietary restrictions, the kitchen will be available for food preparation by a supervising adult.

CAMP HEALTH OFFICER

A resident health officer will be on call 24 hours a day at Mt Bayou Lake Scout Camp. Most minor accidents and illness can be efficiently handled by the health officer. Special arrangements for treatment of more serious cases requiring a visit to a hospital have been made with the local Hospital in Ville Platte.

SHOWERS

Hot showers are available for scouts and leaders in the campsites. Please be sure your scouts are supervised in some manner when they are in the showers.

WEATHER

The weather in Louisiana is unpredictable at best. Everything from hot sunny days to quick thunderstorms. **COME PREPARED!!!** Plan ahead and no weather condition will be a surprise. Please check the Personal Equipment List for any necessary items.

UNIFORMS

The official Scout uniform should be worn to dinner Saturday evening . Camp T-Shirts will be available for purchase at the Trading Post for more casual wear. Hats are recommended for everyone as the Louisiana sun can be blazing hot. Shoes must be worn at all times. Please no open-toed shoes or aqua socks.

A SCOUT IS CLEAN

Please encourage your scouts to put trash in its proper place. Keep MBL. clean!!

FIREARMS AND ARCHERY EQUIPMENT

No personal firearms or archery equipment will be allowed in camp. We will provide everything needed for shooting sports.

TOBACCO USE

The Evangeline Area Council Executive Board passed a policy in 1996 which states that all facilities and events of the Evangeline Area Council are to be smoke free. This policy complies with the national policy of tobacco use in Scouting. We will provide a location for those to smoke who must. Please refrain from smoking in buildings and in front of Scouts.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES/DRUGS

It is strictly against BSA policy to possess alcoholic beverages and/or drugs on a BSA property. Those unwilling to abide by this policy will be asked to leave the property immediately.

LIQUID AND LP FUELED APPLIANCES AND FIREWORKS

Adult leaders may have liquid fuel or LP approved lanterns. Scouts are not permitted to operate this equipment. Liquid fuel must not be stored in the campsite. If you have liquid fuel for a lantern, it must be stored in the camp fuel shed which is kept locked. No open flames or highly flammable material are allowed in tents. **Liquid fuel should never be used around open flames or as a fire starter. Also, NO fireworks will be permitted in camp.** Please turn in any empty fuel containers to the Camp Director or Camp Ranger. They may end up in a fire and could explode.

FOOD IN TENTS

Food or candy must not be stored in tents. This practice will attract unwanted furry critters.
