The **University of Scouting** is a comprehensive training offered by the Evangeline Area Council. It has been designed for all new and experienced leaders in all registered positions to strengthen and enhance his/her knowledge of the many aspects of the Scouting program.

REGISTRATION AND FEE INFORMATION For applications and fees submitted on or before January 12th, 2007, the cost of \$20 includes lunch, patch, booklet for primary college, and \$10.00 Scout Bucks for Scout Store/Trading Post. Incentives: Door prizes including main door prize of a family camping package (Family Tent, Propane Stove & Lantern). Unit Recognition: Every unit that has 2 paid attendees will receive a streamer for flag. For every person that attends the unit will be entered into a door prize drawing for a \$100 credit on their account at the office. We will set up a daycare program for children ages 2-7. This will be limited to 8 children. For Cub Scout age youth a program will be developed to teach belt loops and other achievements. After January 12th, the fee will be \$25.00. That fee will only cover registration. Late applicants should please plan to bring their own lunch. BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

To earn a Bachelor of Science degree in the College of Cub Scouting, the College of Boy Scouting/Venturing or the College of Commissioners, you must meet all of the following requirements:

- ◆ You must be a registered Scouter at the time you apply for the degree.
- ◆ For a B.S. degree from the College of Cub Scouting or the College of Boy Scouting/Venturing, you must have completed the Fast Start Training for your area of interest (for example, you must have completed Cub Scout Fast Start Training if you are seeking a degree from the College of Cub Scouting). For those seeking a B.S. degree from the College of Commissioners, you must have completed the Fast Start Training for either Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, or Venturing.
- ◆ You must have completed basic training for the program in which you seek your degree (i.e., Cub Scout Basic Training for a degree from the College of Cub Scouting, Scoutmaster Fundamentals for a degree from the College of Boy Scouting/Venturing, or Commissioner Basic Training for a degree from the College of Commissioners).
- ◆ Your Youth Protection Training must be current at the time you apply for a degree.

- ◆ You must complete three courses from those listed for your College (Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts/Venturing or Commissioner).
- ◆ You must complete three more courses from either the General Sessions, or for any College including your own (be careful not to take too many courses from your College as electives; courses can only be used once for any purpose).

MASTER OF SCIENCE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

To earn a Master of Science Degree in the College of Cub Scouting, the College of Boy Scouting/Venturing or the College of Commissioners you must meet all of the following requirements:

- ◆ You must be a registered Scouter at the time you apply for the degree.
- ◆ Your Youth Protection Training must be current at the time you apply for a degree.
- ◆ You must have earned a Bachelor's degree from the same college for which you are seeking a Master's degree.
- ◆ You must complete three additional courses from those listed for your College.
- ◆ You must complete three more additional courses from either the General Sessions, or for any College including your own.
- ◆ You must have completed the Council's Train-the-Trainer course.
- ◆ You must have earned eight (8) service units. An explanation of service units follows the requirements for a Ph. D. degree.

Ph. D. DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

- ◆ You must be a registered Scouter at the time you apply for the degree.
- ◆ Your Youth Protection Training must be current at the time you apply for a degree.
- ◆ You must have earned a Bachelor's and Master's degree in the same college for which you are seeking a Ph. D degree.
- ◆ You must complete three additional courses from those listed for your College. Completion of a Wood Badge course, National Camp School course(s) or a Philmont training course(s) can be substituted to meet this requirement, but only at the Ph. D. level.
- ◆ You must earn twelve (12) additional service units (see below for definition of an service unit).

Service Units

A participant can earn a service units (SU) by serving as an adult-to-adults instructor at Council or District training opportunities. For example, a SU can be earned by serving on the BALOO/Webelos training staff, by serving as an instructor at a Scoutmaster Fundamentals course or by serving as an instructor at the University of Scouting. 2. Participants may attend classes offered by any College. If you are a first time participant and you are seeking a degree, it is recommended that you make your first five or six choices from your primary College. Some classes may have a limited class size and will be filled on first come, first serve basis before we process your application. If you develop two or three alternate choices, you should have little trouble getting at least three courses from within your College.
3. The University reserves the right to cancel classes or make appropriate changes in order to accommodate the largest number of Scouters.
4. To indicate your preferences, consult the attached Class Schedule and make your choices accordingly. Please note that some courses are offered at more than one time. Please note the scheduled times for all your courses and schedule to avoid conflicts. Place your choices in the spaces provided on the registration form, being sure to include the complete session number (take this information from the class schedule). **KEEP A COPY OF THE REGISTRATION FOR YOURSELF; BRING IT WITH YOU.**
5. You must select your primary College when you register. When you arrive at the University, you will check in under that College and receive your personal schedule of classes.
