Do you want to be a better youth leader? Join us for the 2019 University of Scouting, presented by the Evangeline Area Council on Saturday, January 12, 2019 from 8 AM – 4:30 PM at the New Iberia Senior High (NISH) located at 1301 Admiral Doyle, New Iberia, LA. This catalog provides course descriptions, along with class times and instructors, to assist participants with on-line registration.

What is the University of Scouting?

The University of Scouting (UoS) is Evangeline Area Council's premier one-day supplemental training opportunity for all registered adult Scout leaders and parents interested in becoming leaders or understanding what leaders in Scouting do and for Scouts (ages 11-17) who are interested in learning certain topics either for youth or in General Studies. UoS goes beyond Fast Start, Specific and even Advanced Training to impart knowledge & skills on specific topics that help leaders excel in their efforts to deliver the promise of Scouting. The UoS goal is to provide information that is practical, immediately useful and not readily available at the local unit level. To that end, our instructors bring skills and insights to UoS that have been developed through many years of Scouting experience. UoS is also a great opportunity to network with other Scout leaders, make new friends, and share best practices throughout the Council and its Districts. This year we added some new panel forums and classes and dropped some classes that were not attended last year.

What will I do at UoS?

You will take classes that you are interested in learning more about that will assist you in providing a Quality Program to our youth. Note that you may take any combination of courses from the colleges of Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, and/or General Studies.

How do I Register?

Online registration opens on or about **December 17**. To register go to the training section of www.eacbsa.org. Registration may also be made at the Scout Office through **January 9, 2019**, the cost for UoS is \$20 for participants, which includes a UoS patch, lunch, and handouts. **On January 10, 2019, the registration cost increases to \$30, plus \$5 for lunch. Walk-in registration on the day of training increases to \$40, \$5 for lunch provided we have tickets left and lunch is not guaranteed.** During online registration, you will select classes organized within six periods, corresponding to the starting times of the classes, as itemized in the course listings herein.

Like last year, Scouters can pay as you go. Only see two classes that you want take? Sign up and pay per class, this year we will charge \$5 per class. Scouters desiring to eat lunch at UoS must also pay a \$5 fee for lunch.

STOP!!! Are other leaders in your unit attending this training? Take advantage of the 50/50 option. If 50% of your registered leaders attend UoS and register before January 9th the cost is \$10 per Scouter. Registered Scouters must sign up for the entire day of training. Leaders register individually and pay the regular price, after UoS refunds will be made to Units. Parents and Youth costs remain \$20 each.

Both registration and payment must be turned in prior to January 9, 2019, or the registration will be considered late. Based on class selections and the instructors, classes may be cancelled and participants will be notified to change their selections.

Leader Specific Program

Every boy deserves a trained leader! Let’s make our Council 100% trained. To help us achieve that goal UoS will provide a Trained Patch to all leaders that are 100% trained for their current registered position or a position they are considering registering for in the future. This is being offered to parents, new leaders and leaders who have never attended training for their specific leadership position.

How Can I Volunteer to Teach or Serve as Staff for UoS?

Volunteer instructors are selected by the respective Deans from each College. Faculty Tuition is as follows: FREE if teaching at least two (2) class periods and \$5 if under two to cover lunch. Volunteers teaching or assisting with UoS will be counted as participating leaders and will count toward 50/50 incentive.

What do I get for attending UoS?

Every participant attending UoS will get a temporary patch which can be worn on your uniform’s right pocket. Leaders who are 100% trained in their position and attend UoS can also earn the coveted T3 Council Shoulder Patch. Baden-Powell believed in trained leader, show everyone that you are Youth Protection (YPT) ***Trained***, Position Specific ***Trained*** and UoS ***Trained***. Do you see the common tread? Be T3! Anyone wishing to earn this patch must bring a copy of their YPT certificate and position specific training and attend at least four (4) UoS classes.

What’s for lunch?

Your lunch includes a jambalaya and chicken, with a side of potato salad, drink and a desert.

UNIVERSITY OF SCOUTING REGISTRATION INFORMATION

1. Please read the entire brochure; each college offers numerous classes.
2. Participants may attend classes offered by any College. Some classes may have a limited class size and will be filled on first come, first serve basis before we process your application. If you develop two or three alternate choices, you should have little trouble getting at least one of the three courses of your choice.
3. The University reserves the right to cancel classes or make appropriate changes in order to accommodate the largest number of Scouters.
4. To indicate your preferences, consult the attached **Class Schedule Grid (Appendix A)** and make your choices accordingly. Classrooms will be assigned after registration is complete and the maps (Appendix B) will be provided at registration. There are some courses offered at more than one time. Please note the scheduled times for all your courses and schedule to avoid conflicts. Please select one course in each period column by writing the course number on your registration sheet or when you register on line.
5. When you arrive at the University, there will be two separate lines for check-in: those who have pre-registered and a walk-up registration table

COURSE DETAILS

CODE: CUB=College of Cub Scouting, BOY=College of Boy Scouting, GEN=College of General Studies, YOU=Open to Youth only, PAN=Panel, BAS=Basic Training Courses. Each class is designated by a Program, Course Number and Course Hours. For Example CUB011 (CUB = Falls under the Cub Scout Program, 01 is the sequence number of the course and 1 is the number of hours the class lasts.

COLLEGE OF CUB SCOUTING

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

CUB011 - The Road to Relaxation: De-stressing new CS parents (1 hr) Learn ways to effectively help new parents understand the ins and outs of Cub Scouting. Manage today's multitude of communication byways to disseminate information quickly and easily.

CUB031 – Messenger of Peace (1hr) Messengers of Peace is a global service project program carried out by millions of Scouts throughout the world. The BSA challenges Scouts and leaders to demonstrate their service spirit to make a real impact on global peace and the quality of life in local communities. Come find out how your Unit can be Messengers of Peace.

CUB041 - Pack Planning: Build an Adventure (1 hr) Getting people and activities together for successful year won't happen on its own. How to best utilize your resources, leaders, and parents to build an exciting calendar.

CUB051 - Oh The Places We Can Go: Overnights and field trips within your Reach (1 hr) Learn what opportunities for exploration await discovery by your Cub Scouts! You will leave with phone numbers, addresses, and tips for successful pack wide or den trips around our area.

CUB071 - Utilizing Your Den Chief (1 hr) Having a Den Chief can make life so much easier for leaders. What can a Boy Scout do in your den and pack meetings? Find out and see how the office of Den Chief can help bridge the gap between Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts.

CUB081 - Ethan the Builder: Webelos projects (1 hr) You have looked through the Webelos book and you have no idea how you are going to tackle these building and engineering projects. We will show you how to get it done!

CUB091 - Boy Scout 101: Webelos Transition (1 hr) WE'LL BE LOYAL Scouts! Helping your Webelos parents navigate the tricky waters of moving from the Cub Scout program to Boy Scout activities. Learn how to make positive connections between your Pack and area Troops to aid in the transition.

CUB101 - It's All About That Bling, That Bling, and Patches (1 hr) Learn about what lies beyond the adventure loops/pins and rank advancements. What other awards can your cub scouts be earning?

CUB121 - So You Want to go Camping? (1 hr) Attention all parents, leaders, and scouts: nature is where it's at! The first campout as a family can be scary, but it doesn't have to be. How to actually be a "happy camper" when you set out with your pack.

This class can be taken separately from CUB193. *Note – Leaders who take this course are not authorized by BSA policy to run ranges for their units, but are certified to run ranges during Council/District events and camps such as Cub Adventure and Day Camp.

CUB193 – CS Shooting Sports (Part II – Archery) (3 hrs) This class teaches leaders how to develop, set-up, and run Archery ranges safely for Cub Scouts. This class can be taken separately from CUB183. *Note – Leaders who take this course are not authorized by BSA policy to run ranges for their units, but are certified to run ranges during Council/District events and camps such as Cub Adventure and Day Camp.

CUB201 – Pepping up the Pack Meeting (1hr) How to improve your pack meeting planning and executing with minimal effort for maximum results.

CUB211 – Taking the Frustration out of Den Meetings (1hr) Den Meeting planning and how to optimize parents, scouts, and Den Chief.

CUB221 - How does Scoutbook Help (1 hr) Learn about the BSA's new advancement management online system started by a volunteer like you. This easy to use program tracks your Scout's progress, helps you create calendars that are compatible with various platforms, sends reminders to parents, leaders and Scouts and much, much more!

COLLEGE OF BOY SCOUTING

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BOY011 - Putting Punch into your Troop Meetings (1 hr) How to help your youth leaders, not adults, incorporate games, competitions and other activities into their troop meetings. When to teach and provide instructions during a meeting and when to do it on a camp out.

BOY021 - Merit Badge Counselor Orientation (1 hr) What does it takes to be a Merit Badge Counselor?

BOY031 - What's the Order of the Arrow (OA) All About? (1 hr) Discover what the OA is all about. Learn how the OA can help instill a sense of service and leadership in your Scouts that can greatly benefit your unit. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY041 – Females in Scouting (1hr) How women can help promote and participate in a troop camp out or backpack trek. What issues come up and how to work it out. Females in scouting are here to stay, making it work is to your advantage.

BOY051 - Life to Eagle (1 hr) Merit Badges, Service Projects, SM Conferences, and the Board of Reviews (including Eagle BOR) needed to make the rank of Eagle. Includes ideas for Eagle Courts of Honor ceremonies.

BOY061 - Backpack Cooking (1 hr) Offers tips and procedures for cooking on the trail, different types of pack stoves, recipes for gumbo, red beans and rice and many others. (Recommended for Boy Scout and Venture leaders, but open to all). Food samples will be provided. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY071 - Beginner Backpacking (1 hr) Equipment, training and preparation: including low impact and Leave No Trace Camping. The “how to’s” to beginning backpacking. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY081 - Advanced Backpacking (1 hr) Equipment, training and preparation: including low impact. The “how to’s” of packing at 11,000 feet and desert camping. Tips for a 3-4 day pack trek. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY091 - Putting your Backpack on a Diet (1 hr) (Ultra light backpacking) Does your toothbrush still have a handle? If so, you still had too much weight in your pack. Come find out how to cut out those extra ounces that really add up. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY111 - Troop Court of Honor Ceremonies (1 hr) Discussion of ideas for conducting ceremonies including meeting openings and closings, advancement recognitions. Make it special? When is the best time to hold a COH ? How to make it meaningful for the Scout and his family? How many times a year?

BOY121 - Planning the Annual Troop Calendar (1 hr) How and why you should plan a yearly calendar for your Troop. Using a Google calendar.

BOY131 - Introduction to Maps & Compass (1 hr) An introduction to the particulars of maps and the potential use of maps in conjunction with compasses in your Scouting program. This course is for you if you are a complete novice with maps and compasses. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY141 - Knots (1hr) Learn the basic Scout knots, when to use them and how to get Scouts to retain how to tie them. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY151 - Lashing (1 hr) An introduction to basic lashing techniques (Recommended for Boy Scout and Venture leaders, but open to all). Ideas to keep your Scouts busy and out of trouble during long term camps. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY161 - Teaching Wilderness Survival (1 hr) Are you preparing to teach the Wilderness Survival Merit Badge to your troop? Learn the basics and the how to’s on teaching Wilderness Survival to Boy Scouts and have some fun learning yourself!!

BOY171 - Troop Chaplaincy (1 hr) The how to's on the Chaplaincy position of leadership in the Boy Scouts. Prepare your troop Chaplain to fulfill his responsibilities. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY181 - How to drink Unclean H2O (Water Purification and Outdoor Hygiene) (1 hr) Need to learn how to take that water from the trail and make it potable (drinkable)? Want to learn how to remain clean on your extended trips and to visit mother nature in the backcountry? Take this course! (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY191 - Where to go Camping (1 hr) How many camping spots are there 1 hour, 2 hours from your home? Where to go if you want to swim, fish, canoe, or backpack? How to go camping and not pay fees. Activities to do once you get there.

BOY201 - Hiking in the Area (1 hr) The Acadiana area has lots of places to hike, see new things and experience getting away from it all. Learn from an avid outdoors person of some places to go yourself or take your group hiking.

BOY211 - Hammock Camping (1 hr) Learn the advantage of hammock camping, staying off the cold wet ground and camping on a hill side with ease. Come take a lay and try one out. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY221 - STEM Merit Badges (1 hr) What are the "STEM Merit Badges, why would your Scouts be interested in these and who can teach them.

BOY231 - Useful and Edible Plants (1 hr) Come learn about which local plants can be eaten and which can be used for other useful purposes. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY241 - The Functioning Troop Committee (1 hr) Learn how a well synchronized Committee functions, work together to provide your Scouts with the best program. What do we do? How the troop committee is formed, how it functions, what are the responsibilities of each member and how it interacts with the adult and youth troop leadership?

BOY251 - Introduction to Troop Advancement (1 hr) Timely rank advancement is vital to help Scouts succeed and stay active in the troop. Advancement should be a part of every troop meeting. How to keep accurate records.

BOY271 - Advanced Knots (1hr) Learn some advanced Scout knots, when to use them and how to get Scouts to retain how to tie them. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

BOY281 - Advancement for your First Year Scouts (1hr) Getting a scout thru his first year and successfully getting to first class. The Troop, the Patrol, the Scout and the Parent.

BOY291 - Merit Badge Advancement (1 hr) Ever wonder how Scouts earn merit badges? This course will explain how the process works from Start to Finish, from picking, to requirement completion and blue cards.

BOY300 – Where to Go On an Overnight Canoe Trip (1hr) Where to go for a weekend canoe trip in our area, learn what and how to pack for an overnight canoe trip, where and how to pitch a tent. How well you can eat on the water.

BOY310 – Where to go Backpacking (1 hr) Where to go for a weekend backpacking trip in our area.

BOY320 - How does Scoutbook Help (1 hr) Learn about the BSA's new advancement management online system started by a volunteer like you. This easy to use program tracks your Scout's progress, helps you create calendars that are compatible with various platforms, sends reminders to parents, leaders and Scouts and much, much more!

COLLEGE OF GENERAL STUDIES

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

GEN011 - Abilities, Not Disabilities (1 hr) Leaders can gain the confidence and insight they need to teach those with special needs! This may include boys with autism, learning delays, social disorders, and physical limitations. By focusing on positive strategies and teamwork, leaders will learn how to serve these youth.

GEN021 - Re-charter and Journey to Excellence (JTE) (1 hr) Important re-charter information and Journey to Excellence for units. It is designed to make life easier for our front-line volunteers and provide them with better resources and tools for building a strong program that attracts and retains youth. We will be providing you with training to help you be successful in utilizing JTE with your units. Get the information you need to successfully recognize your unit's and district's achievements.

GEN041 - Recognition and Thanking Adult Leaders (1 hr) They might not admit this, but most leaders and parent volunteers are grateful for simple recognition and thanks. The session will cover a variety of ways to recognize and thank them: Training awards, recognition knots, special district awards, certificates, and a variety of other simple ideas.

GEN051 - Dutch Oven Cooking (1 hr) This class covers basic Dutch Oven cooking. Learn about what you can and cannot cook in an oven. Learn about temperature control as well as how to care for your ovens. Basic recipes will be covered. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

GEN061 - Dress for Success: Uniforming (1 hr) Learn the proper "Class A" dress code for Cubs, Scouts and Leaders and the proper placement of all patches and awards as per BSA National Standards.

GEN071 - Making Your Unit Financially Healthy (1 hr) How can your unit be financially sound? What are the best practices of the most successful treasurers? A great scouting program needs a solid financial base. Learn how to take your unit down the path of stable finances toward great programming and better retention. Put together the essential pieces of fundraising, budgeting, accounts, and evaluation.

GEN081 - Leave No Trace (1 hr) Become a better camper. Upgrade your outdoor skills to reduce your outdoor impact. Provides what you need to know for scout advancement sign off, Venture awards and wilderness permits. Those seeking LNT award credit must complete the online awareness course at <http://Int.org/learn/online-awareness-course> Joe Klein Instructor. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

GEN091 - Overcoming Social Barriers (1 hr) This course will delve into the social issues of our day such as peer pressure, and the effects that broken families have on the psyche of the young people we serve. We will look at how we can motivate and empower these young people to be successful through scouting as well as overcome their social background.

GEN121 - Conflict Resolutions (1 hr) Internal conflicts can quickly drain the energy from a unit. Learn proper techniques to handle various conflicts that may arise between Youth-Youth, Adult-Youth and Adult-Adult.

GEN 141 - Roundtables (1 hr) Ever wonder what a Roundtable is? Why should you attend them? Are they really beneficial. Find out what really goes on.

GEN151 - How to Conduct an Interfaith Worship (1 hr) The purpose of this course is to teach how to conduct a simple interfaith worship service at camp, on the trail, or during other outings. When we conduct Scouting activities, it is important that we call attention to a Scout's "Duty to God" through prayer at meal times and at other appropriate occasions. (Also open to Youth Scouts).

GEN161 - Conducting Order of the Arrow Elections (1 hr) Learn the proper way to conduct an OA Election to ensure that all candidates are treated fairly.

GEN191 - Why Attend Woodbadge (1 hr) What is Woodbadge all about and why should I attend this training. Learn why attending Woodbadge can make you a better leader and provide your youth with an amazing program.

GEN201 - The Delegating Leader (1 hr) Burned out? Don't do it all yourself. Using other adult leaders effectively to deliver a better program. How to divide up the work? How to use those parents that don't want to camp? Using Assistants, Committee Members, Charter Organization and Parents effectively to deliver a better program.

GEN211 - National High Adventure Camps (1 hr) What is a National High Adventure Camp? Learn about the opportunities of attending National High Adventure Camps like Philmont, Sea Base, Northern Tier and the Summit.

GEN221 - Using Tentaroo (1 hr) Frustrated with registering through Tentaroo? Find out how to use Tentaroo and get rid of your frustrations. You'll be registering for everything once you see just how easy it can be. Boy Scout focused section.

GEN231 - Using Tentaroo (1 hr) Frustrated with registering through Tentaroo? Find out how to use Tentaroo and get rid of your frustrations. You'll be registering for everything once you see just how easy it can be. Cub Scout focused section.

GEN241 - Conducting Professional Flag Ceremonies (1 hr) Learn the simple steps for running professional flag ceremonies in your units and in the community.

GEN251 – New Member Coordinator (1hr) This class will introduce the new position of New Member Coordinator for Troops and Packs. This class also includes ideas on how to welcome new families into your Troop or Pack.

GEN261 – What is a Unit Commissioner and What Do They Do? (1hr)

GEN271 – Overview of Sea Scouting (1hr) Introduction to the mission of Sea Scouting, its aims & methods, and unique place in the Boy Scouts of America. Youth-led aspects of the program are emphasized, including Flotilla activities and the trail to Quartermaster. This course is valuable for all Scouters who wish to learn more about the Sea Scouting program.

GEN281 – One Philmont with Many Opportunities (1 hr) The Philmont Scout Ranch and the Philmont Training Center combine to offer a full range of experiences from a legendary high adventure Philmont Trek, world class training for BSA positions from Cubs to National, and a unique family vacation experience for all ages. Come discover the magic and make plans to "Geaux to Philmont".

GEN291 – Organizing New Scouting Units (1hr) How to charter a new unit, responsibility of the Charter Organization, etc. How to get a new unit off the ground and running, setting up a committee, funding, etc. Discussion of law suit filed by GSUSA against BSA saying that we are infringing by our use of the words Scouts, and Scouting. How to handle problems of adding girls to our programs, dealing with people who may or may not be supportive, how not to disparage other youth serving organizations while promoting Scouts BSA and Cub Scouts, and how to address girls in the BSA programs.

GEN301 – Catholic Religious Emblems (1hr) What they are and how to earn them.
